Homework/ Class work Policy

Students are expected to practice their instruments at home on a regular basis. Without doing their band "homework", students tend to progress at a slower rate. Sixth graders will be required to document their practice time and turn them in bi-weekly for a grade using the "Practice Record".

Make Up Work Policy

It is rare that band students have written work to make up. On the rare occasion, three days will be permitted for makeup work due to absences. Since the class tends to review the previous day's material as part of the warm-up, students will have the opportunity to cover new material. Students are always expected to review those exercises and concepts during their at home practice time.
